



**Memorandum of Understanding  
between  
Diponegoro University, Indonesia  
and  
the University of Tasmania, Australia**



This agreement, entered into this Monday, day of 27 July 2015 between Diponegoro University and the University of Tasmania is to foster international cooperation in education and research.

**I.**

The agreements between Diponegoro University and the University of Tasmania may include but not be limited to the areas:

- Professional development
- Joint research activities
- Joint scholarly and teaching activities
- Exchange of faculty members
- Exchange of students

**II.**

This Memorandum of Understanding will be identified as the parent document of any future agreement executed between the parties. Further agreements concerning any program will provide details concerning the specific commitments made by each party and will not become effective until they have been reduced to writing and executed by the duly authorised representatives of both parties. The scope of the activities under this agreement and any under any specific agreements executed between the parties shall be determined by the funds regularly available at both institutions for the types of collaboration undertaken. Except as may be stipulated in any specific agreement, each institution shall be responsible for expenses incurred by its employees under this agreement and any other agreements executed between the parties.

**III.**

Diponegoro University and the University of Tasmania agree to designate the following individuals or such other persons notified by that party to oversee and facilitate implementation of this agreement.

The parties agree to ensure that the above-named will:

- promote academic collaboration at faculty levels for research and study;
- act as principal contacts and coordinate all activities within their institutions;
- distribute to each institution information about the faculty, facilities, research, publications, library materials and educational resources of the other institution; and
- periodically review and evaluate past activities and to explore new ideas for future agreements.

**IV.**

Upon signature by each institution, this agreement shall remain in effect for three years from final signature or until terminated by either institution. Such termination by one institution shall be effected by giving the other institution at least six (6) months advance written notice of its intention to terminate. Termination shall be without penalty. If this agreement is validly terminated, neither institution shall be liable to reimburse each other for any monetary or other losses that may result.

The intention of the parties is that the terms of the agreement are not enforceable in a court of law. Further, nothing in this agreement binds either of the parties to enter into any future agreements in relation to its subject matter, if they consider that entering into such agreements would be inconsistent with their requirements.

Nothing in this agreement constitutes the parties as partners, agents or employees of the other and they expressly deny the existence of such a relationship.
